



The **Kidderminster Foodbank** provides food and support to local people in crisis. The Foodbank is part of the Trussell Trust UK wide network. It is run by local churches working together alongside grass root community organisations, statutory agencies, frontline professionals, schools and businesses to

provide emergency non-perishable food to people, using a voucher scheme. Last year the Kidderminster Food Bank fed 2861 individuals by giving three-day emergency food supplies.

FOOD IS DONATED

Schools, churches, businesses and individuals donate non-perishable, in-date food to a foodbank. Large collections often take place as part of Harvest Festival celebrations and food is also collected at supermarkets.

FOOD IS SORTED AND STORED

Volunteers sort food to check that it's in date and pack it into boxes ready to be given to people in need. Nationally over 40,000 people give up their time to volunteer at foodbanks.

PROFESSIONALS IDENTIFY PEOPLE IN NEED

Foodbanks partner with a wide range of care professionals such as doctors, health visitors, social workers and police to identify people in crisis and issue them with a foodbank voucher.

CLIENTS RECEIVE FOOD

Foodbank clients bring their voucher to a foodbank centre where it can be redeemed for three days' emergency food. Volunteers meet clients over a warm drink or free hot meal and are able to signpost people to agencies able to solve the longer-term problem.

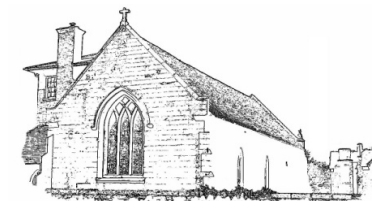
