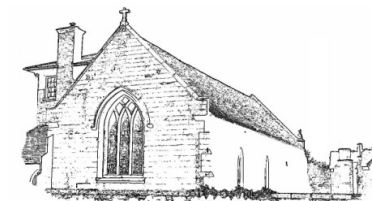

CENTENARY OF THE END OF WORLD WAR ONE.

Chaddesley Corbett Parish Council are co-ordinating a number of events to mark the centenary of the end of World War One.

- On **Saturday 3rd** and **Sunday 4th November** Harvington Hall will be open from 11.30 to 3.00 with WW1 re-enactors, memorabilia and family activities.
- At the end of the 10.30 Mass on **Sunday 4th** Father John will lay a wreath in our churchyard on the World War One grave of George Griffin.
- On **Sunday 11th November** there will be a Remembrance Day service and re-dedication of the war-memorial at St Cassian's church from 10.00 to 11.15 and Father John will be taking part. Please note that Chaddesley village street will be closed to traffic from 10.30 to 11.30. However, Mass times at St Mary's will be as usual at 8.30 and 10.30.
